In conjunction with the current exhibition *Inside El Salvador*, photojournalist **Donna DeCesare**, Assistant Professor of Photojournalism at The University of Texas at Austin, presents "Destiny's Children: L.A. Gangs in Post-war El Salvador."

DeCesare's photo narratives about youth affected by war, trauma, and gangs explore the personal choices and social stigmas that define the fate of young people across the Americas. DeCesare will talk about the role of photography in social activism and how her website can support the efforts of educators, activists, and young people working to overcome the widespread legacy of youth violence.
